Beckford grew his fortune in Jamaica, but he spent most of his adult life in London, winning the office of Lord Mayor twice. He was one of the few politicians to have experienced imperial growing pains on both sides of the Atlantic, and his life offers a riveting look at how the expanding empire challenged existing political, social, and cultural norms."The first complete study of the life of one of the most important transatlantic figures of the mid-18th century, the book is illuminating in detail and rich in implications."
